How To Inspect Your Lawn For Brown Patch Fungus Disease

Watch For The Conditions & Symptoms

When it comes to lawn diseases, understanding the conditions of disease development and the appearance of the symptoms will help you to pay attention to anything that might signal brown patch in your turf.

STEP 1 Inspect After Moist Weather Conditions



The local weather conditions affect development of brown patch more than everything else. Prolonged periods of relatively humid weather with extended timeframe of dew left on the turf, as well as warmer evening temperatures create the perfect environment for brown patch to take hold of your turf, which can begin to develop within a day or two.

This weather is the ideal time to inspect your lawn for brown patch symptoms, since it will not likely develop in your yard without these conditions. Look closely for any irregularities.

STEP 2 Check Often Between Late Spring And Early Fall

This is a summer disease for turf, usually affecting lawns from late spring to early fall. This is the time to be on the lookout for brown patch symptoms

STEP 3 Look For The Symptoms of Brown Patch



Make sure you are aware of the symptoms of brown patch fungus disease. Brown patch can resemble other patch diseases, but the large, uneven circular brownish patches of grass surrounded by a dark border are some good indicators of brown patch.

The individual leaf blades will have lesions that are not any particular shape.
