Treating clover in your yard can be accomplished by using broadleaf herbicides, and knowing when to apply your clover control product will help you to get rid of clover quickly and effectively.

A broadleaf herbicide labeled for control of clover will be an effective tool to get rid of the clover in your yard. Here are some timing tips when using an herbicide to kill clover:

- While you can treat clover with herbicide throughout the growing season, a fall application of herbicide is generally more effective on clover.
- If you want to treat for clover in the heat of summer, avoid treating when temperatures are above 80 degrees to minimize damage to grass.

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Signs of Clover

Clover's small white flowers and petal shaped leaves can quickly take over a vulnerable lawn. This weed is particularly a problem in cool season turf.

Clover Growing Conditions:
Thrives in soils with insufficient fertilization (low-nitrogen).



Treatment

- 1 Apply pre-emergent herbicide**
Work to prevent clover from growing by maintaining a healthy, properly fertilized lawn and by applying a pre-emergent herbicide in the spring.
- 2 Apply broadleaf herbicide labeled for clover**
Treat existing clover with a broadleaf herbicide product labeled for use on clover. Fall is the best time to treat clover.

Tip If you can't wait until fall to control your yard for clover, you can apply an herbicide for some control, but make sure you apply it when temperatures are below 80 degrees to avoid injuring your grass.
