Where Does Creeping Charlie Grow?



Creeping Charlie grows across the United States. The weed is often found in areas of the lawn that have the following traits:

- Damp, moist areas with poor drainage
- Shaded areas
- Beneath trees and shrubs
- Thin turf

When Does Creeping Charlie Grow?



Creeping Charlie grows from the spring to the fall, depending on local temperatures. The weed is often confused with henbit, a winter-annual weed. Creeping Charlie grows in the spring and fall, while henbit grows in the fall and winter.
